Board Retreat

Again this year, the board members met for meetings following dinner on Friday and breakfast on Saturday at the Country Lane RV Resort. Time was also spent on learning about each other and networking in a quiet atmosphere where cell phones do not have reception.

Each committee gave a report for the previous activities and the group discussed the financial situation of the ReUse Store as well as the housing ministry. The board appointed treasurer, Verne Blalack, to create a budget for 2014.

Clint Kunze, of the Shoshone Mountain Retreat, (formerly Shoshone Base Camp) described the number of volunteer workers who will be attending the camp this summer. Last year one group of 60 came to help. This year, 2 groups of 100 people each will be coming to spend a week working on local projects in the Silver Valley.

Some of these "Servant Adventures" crews who stay at the Retreat, owned by Lutherhaven, will be helping us with some of our projects. As with last year, they can work on our Greater Blessings sites as well as a new home site if we have a new family selected. We can provide materials and finances which then are expected to be repaid by the homeowner—who receives the Greater Blessings —when able.

Our biggest need is for volunteers. We <u>need</u> consistent help at the ReUse Store; volunteers: to help with construction projects, in supervisory positions, helpers with and without special skills, "gofers", etc.; more committee members with the Partnership, Family Selection, Fund Raising, and PR Committees; and Gleaners willing to pick up larger donations and make deliveries (we do charge for deliveries which the Gleaners will earn). We especially need a Volunteer Coordinator.

At this time, we are losing money at the ReUse Store so we may have to close it down. \otimes

Need New Dena Mora Rest Stop Overseer!

For Summer of 2014

Jim & Norma Seaton are stepping away from overseeing the Fundraiser Rest Stop at the first rest stops on I-90 just 5 miles East of the ID/MT border.

This fundraiser is a fun one for those who volunteer to work it. We now have 2 trailers to serve coffee, cookies & iced tea to travelers from 8am to 4pm (Idaho time). There are people who bake us cookies and some people buy coffee, etc. to supply the trailers and those who volunteer to work either a ½ day or whole day shift. Jim & Norma usually camped over at Cabin City where they were available to help out in an emergency, but this is not a prerequisite, just a fun thing to do.

Duties are all lined out for the new overseers, from calling the Montana Transportation Dept. in January to set up dates the overseers want, to applying for the Thrivent funds (lined out in a notebook) to calling people who have served and new people who would like to serve in some capacity. Then making sure the trailers are well equipped and someone will get them to the Rest Stop & back to Osburn and cleaned out and ready to be covered for winter (unless someone else wants to use them). Next is the follow-up with Thrivent.

Money is deposited at the Sheriff's Office each evening, so you would be expected to get it at the end of the week (usually a week, that would be up to the overseers)

Duties may be delegated to other volunteers as the Overseers see fit. But all of the signs, deposit slips, names of volunteers from past years, lists of supplies needed, instructions for workers etc. are in the notebook and forms can be transferred from the Seaton's computer for use.

Jim & Norma will not be available to work this year, but will serve as mentors. Norma may have back surgery. Contact them at 208-786-9903.

We do have volunteers who look forward to helping with this project each year and people are familiar with our need for cookies, etc, which are donated. Please volunteer to take the leadership role for this event.

The time available for this event with the Montana Transportation Dept is **August 4**th to 8th.


