### "Professional Volunteer," Bev Lightner

On Monday, October 9<sup>th</sup>, I had the honor of sitting with Bev Lightner in her son's home in Osburn for the purpose of learning more about her past, present, and hopes for the future.

Bev has spent most of her life in the western part of the United States. She was born the oldest of six children, who then lived in Woodland, Washington, for nine or ten years, followed by some time in southern California, then in Redding, California, for a while, and since 1997, has been a resident of the Silver Valley of Idaho.

Along the way, Bev worked in Real Estate, Mortgage Banking, and, now, best of all, as a "professional volunteer," where she is the chair person of the ReUse Store Committee, serves on SVfCH's Board of Directors, and is a co-manager of the ReUse Store.

Bev's husband, John, was also very proud of and active in the ReUse Store. He donated his 1965 Ford pickup truck, an electric Lowrey organ, an antique Victrola record player & record collection, and a good assortment of automotive tools to the store before he passed away on April 1<sup>st</sup> of 2012.

Bev is the parent of three boys and grandma to five, one of whom, 5-year-old Amani, occasionally comes to the store to help grandma. Bev is also the great grandmother of two boys, and, like most grandparents, thinks highly of her offspring and their families.

When you are in Smelterville, stop at the ReUse Store to meet Bev, Verne & Judy Blalack, and some of the other volunteers who spend much of their time there. 



We not only need to cover the expenses of operating and improving the store, but our focus is to earn funds to help with our housing ministry—both with new homeowners (we have finished 18 homes) and with Greater Blessings projects where we do minor repairs for homeowners who cannot either afford materials or do the repairs themselves. In neither case, is it a "give away". We expect to be repaid for our expenses so we can then help someone else.
