

With only a month left of this year, we are hoping to finish both the Osburn house with John "Boy" and the modular (trailer) home replacement with Krista Kirby. We still need volunteers to work on both projects.

We have had some help with the painting under the tutelage of Trisha Waldo. Pastor Brandon Crislip brought two young men from Coeur d'Alene one day. The fellows have completed a program with Pastor Tim Remington's Altar Church. Another day, Ian Heiser and CJ Leetch stopped by for several hours. In his spare time, John "Boy" has been diligently sanding; priming; staining; using shellac to cover stains that kept bleeding through; painting; and putting the finishing coats on two floors. The results are really impressive.

Rick Gilbert will do more carpentry work in the smaller bedroom when he returns from his project in Mexico. Then that room can also be painted.

However, we still need volunteers to help distribute insulation in the attic and to blow it in one of the outside walls so that wall can then be sided.

At Krista Kerby's site, Dave Rust is erecting the supporting post for the snow roof that must be installed before we can get the home insured. He readied the "sauna tube" forms and poured some concrete around the base with Building Inspector Mark Magnus's approval. Dave hopes to have his part of the structure up before Thanksgiving. Then someone else will do the sheathing and installing the roofing.


