

Construction Site Reports

The Sunny Slopes Lake Site

Thanks to the Lake family and friends, future home owners-to-be, volunteers, Mike Humphrey, Chris Leetch, Josh Baugh, Swede Little, and site supervisors, Bob Larson and Kevin Hutchings, the mudding will be finished by the time you read this. The attic has 18 inches of insulation in it (R60), so it is easier to heat now. In January we hope to get the texturing done and also the painting. Then the construction inspector will let us use the gas furnace rather than our 110 volt heaters. At this stage in construction the Board members and the family become anxious for us to finish. I'm just glad that Mike and Chris give us their labor on Mondays and Fridays, otherwise we would only be working on the weekend with the family, their friends and future homeowners.

From now on, we'll only be able to use Kevin as a supervisor when he gets a day off now and then, as he started to work at the Lucky Friday mine. However, Swede Little through the "Experience Works" program is giving us a few days a week which really helps. Remember, Bob Larson is willing to supervise any day of the week if someone wishes to help "people in need" to build their own homes. Call 786-9741

With Kevin able to run the Lake site, Bob, Mike & Chris have finished the drywalling on the Little Shop. Now with Kevin gone, Bob will be concentrating on the Lake home and the Little Shop paining will be put on hold. Would you or your friends like to paint the drywall on the Little Shop? Furniture Exchange provides electricity to us so we have electric heat available.

The Mullan Home

Thanks to Swede's help, we only need to build an interior wall along the back bedroom wall (we build double exterior walls) and run electricity in it before we can get the final "rough in" electrical inspection. We would like to have the electrical roughed in before we finish the Lake Home so we can shift Bob's crew there when they finish the Lake home. I'm slowly getting a bad shoulder in better condition and hope to be on site more often in the future.

In this severe recession, we've been glad to be able to use and pay two part time supervisors and give Swede an opportunity to be paid a little by "Experience Works." With a few more volunteers, we could complete our homes faster and give Bob a little more work. (He really needs to have some dental work done—not covered by Medicare.) Come join us—it's healthier than sitting around watching TV and looks good on your résumé.
