Here is a review of the 2017 Ride the Wall event from a First Aid/Medical perspective. The support team includes experienced EMTs, nurses, and therapists. John Wilson, a veteran of many "Wall" rides and a longtime nurse, coordinated the aid staff. Prior to the event he examined the course conditions, organized staff assignments, and provided words of insight and encouragement to the riders.

Summer solstice arrived with near perfect conditions with blue skies and warm temperatures. A bike ride in the sunshine seemed a fitting way to kick off summer. Thirty-four riders went up and over "the Wall" (aka CCC Road or Wall Ridge Road) and looped back to the Snake Pit. Several other riders opted to forgo the climb and instead chose to enjoy the Trail of the Coeur d'Alenes and double back to Enaville.

Steve Knox of Rose Lake QRU set up his unit at the Cataldo trailhead. Sean and Shea Curran along with Danielle Groth helped direct riders. John had his pick-up/1st aid station headquartered at the top of the trail, while Dave and Sarah Leeds were positioned further along with their hydration/1st aid station. Cory and Andrew Lewis and I provided the "sweep" following the last riders.

While the riders were starting their trek at Enaville, we rode over to Cataldo in Cory's Rhino UTV. We procured refreshments from the friendly folks at the Mission Inn and visited with Steve who had the Rose Lake QRU stationed nearby. He regaled us with interesting stories of local and faraway places. Golfing in the Philippines was never on my must do or bucket list. If it was, I would remove it after hearing Steve talk of golfing among venomous snakes.
