The second group was in charge of building a much needed shed which will help house an overflow of donated items. Once the overflow of items can be sold, the shed will be sold as well.

The Catholic school located in Coeur d'Alene, not only teaches a high level of academics, it also stresses the importance of giving back to the community. With 26 people in all that helped, a total of 78 hours were donated for the benefit of the Fuller Center. When asked why the 8th grade class of Holy Family Catholic School keeps coming back to help out, Kathy Sells, 8th Grade Teacher, said, "The Fuller Center is about giving and helping out the less fortunate and that is the epitome of what Holy Family stands for. It is our honor to return each year to lend a helping hand."

## Haiti Update

On June 3, ProPublica and NPR published an extensive article titled "How the Red Cross Raised Half a Billion Dollars for Haiti and Built Six Homes." It's worth noting that the six homes were actually built by The Fuller Center with a \$48,000 grant from the Red Cross. We stand ready to put more of their funds to work building permanent homes. We've built more than 175 in Haiti so far, and this presentation explains why we set the standard for building in Haiti.
