REQUIREMENTS FOR A FULLER CENTER HOME

- 1. The applicant must have a reliable income large enough to pay off a non-interest loan to cover the cost of the home. We do not discriminate as to the source of the income as long as it is reliable. The cost of our homes is in the neighborhood of \$80,000. The longest contract is 30 years. The monthly payment is usually not over 25% of the monthly income. This means that a minimum monthly income of around \$1300 dollars is necessary to qualify. We follow HUD guidelines.
- 2. An applicant must also show "need" for better or more affordable housing. This means their present housing must be unsafe or inadequate for their needs. It may be adequate, but costs so much that the other basic needs are not met; such as medical, food and clothing needs.
- 3. .The successful applicant must also be willing to "partner" with us. This means they must be willing to put up with the publicity that comes with being a Fuller Center home owner-to-be. Each partner family must provide at least one person aged 13 or older who will contribute at least six (6) hours a week "sweat equity" unless excused by the construction supervisor or ReUse Store manager. We build homes with people, not just for them.

Comments on becoming a successful applicant.

For some, the application is a formidable thing. Information must be found to go into the forms. How much money do you make? How much money do you owe? How can your last landlord be contacted? How do you get a **credit report**? Aristotle is quoted as saying: "Courage is the greatest of all virtues because without it none of the others are possible." His thought applies here. If you have the courage to ask for the needed information, or to ask for help getting it, you may be a successful applicant. The most important variable here is not the information needed, but the <u>courage</u> to ask. Face fears of poor communication skills, fears of letting others know you don't know and don't know how to find out. BE COURAGEOUS! BECOME A SUCCESSFUL APPLICANT!


