



Elliott Stairs Quandary



Nancy Elliot's stairs obviously need replacing. So we asked Rick Gilbert to draft plans to do so.



Shoshone County Building Inspector, Mark Magnus, reviewed Rick's plans noting the need to make them comply with Idaho Building Codes.



At Wallace City Hall, Joanne McCoy issued a building permit with the caveat that it would need to comply with the rules for retaining Wallace's status on the National Historic Register. After reviewing the Building Code changes that Mark requires including different step heights and an additional landing, Verne has decided to approach the Wallace Historical Society for a variance. They will not meet until June.

Bornitz Greater Blessings Project

At the Kootenai County Courthouse in Coeur d'Alene, first, Verne talked to Bob Ankersmit, Deputy Building Official for Kootenai County, about replacing the porch



that is pulling away from Debra Bornitz's home on Bentley Creek in the Cataldo area.



Then he approached Mike Ulrich, Kootenai County Planner, to ensure Debra's home was above the flood level.

If her porch can be designed to fit under the roof of her home without touching the house, then the plans for the new porch can be drawn by our draftsman, Bob Larson. The porch can be made leak proof using flashing and caulk. Otherwise, an engineer needs to draw the plans.

Once the overall plans are drafted and building permit obtained, then Clint Kunze is looking forward to assigning one of his many youth crews to re-roof her home.




