I expect to hear shortly whether I have been voted into office with this parent organization. It is responsible for 62 Covenant Partners in the US (like ours) and Covenant Partners in 16 foreign countries. Our group sends a 10% tithe on undesignated funds to be spent for housing materials in these 3rd world countries,-such as Haiti,-where the cost of construction is significantly lower.

Whether or not I am accepted to this position, I will be resigning most of my local responsibilities. I have tried to fill many hats *but think new ideas from other volunteers will benefit SVFCH* and am afraid that as long as I keep in the harness, no one will really assume some responsibility.

Fund Raising This year, I will be delighted to train and help others to be the contact for Ride the Wall. It is great that Tom Richards is now chairing this event.

Another position that needs to be filled is for chairing the annual Pig Roast. Steps for this event is all laid out but required someone to follow through to make sure the Odd Fellows Pavilion has been reserved, meat & baked bean ingredients, etc., are ordered, tables, chairs, & awnings reserved, and servers recruited. Lou Larson has been our volunteer coordinator for years contacting local home chefs about donating their salads and desserts. She and her husband, Iver, and Norm & Mary Lou Dubiel have also been responsible for signing. I'm sure they would appreciate more help. For our fall fund raisers, Penny Michael and her crew do an excellent job in September and Linda Langer just volunteered to chair our booth at the Arts and Craft Fair in November.

<u>Public Relations</u> We need speakers willing to attend meetings to express our purpose and need; to send articles to the News Press; do interviews on KWAL; and ensure we have posters for our events printed and posted around our valley. (This year, our Ride the Wall poster, which will be posted soon, is designed by graphic designer, Paulette Ross.)

This newsletter, Facebook, and our website come under this category. I would really appreciate a volunteer who has some journalistic training to be an editor. To do a good job, it does take time and forethought. Each month, I start collecting photos, both mine and other photographers', of everything happening and then winnow them to express our commitment to serving in this housing ministry. Our newsletter is our link to the community and really is our most consistent fund raiser.

I truly appreciate Colleen Rosson as our volunteer Facebook coordinator. The website is fairly easy to update each month as is, but a knowledgeable web master could make it more exciting and better.

Greater Blessings Being chair of this committee is very rewarding, as well as occasionally disappointing. When we are able to help homeowners with their repairs and they truly appreciate our efforts, it is fantastic. Occasionally, we are unable to help them due various circumstances. We also have to turn away renters in substandard living conditions since they do not own the house. This committee works with the construction committee and recruits construction supervisors and helpers after the request has been shown to be feasible for our group. We also work with Clint Kunze and his Servant Adventure youth groups on these projects during the summer.

Anyway, I think it is time for me to *re-retire* after 23 years. New voices need to be heard with our message of eliminating substandard housing in our community. *I have witnessed remarkable blossoming of families and felt the glow of approval as "our kids" have graduated from high school and college and/or found other responsible positions. It has been an honor to serve them.*
