Grand Opening of the Fuller Center's "ReUse" Store—October 14

I sat down near the door and welcomed guests who arrived. There was a constant opening and closing of the door. Some people looked all over the store to see what was available to buy. Other people took a quick look and left. There were several that come in and went out several times. There were even some people who came in with donations.

When there was a slight lull, I took a quick "tour" of the store. I had never been there before. When I heard about the "ReUse" Store, I thought it would be filled with tools and equipment for building. Was I SURPRISED as I walked around to find the store was filled with a wide variety of things like light bulbs, dinnerware, sofas, mirrors, books, toys—even an artificial Christmas tree and numerous other things—a wide variety.

The Board of Directors and the volunteers present were waiting for the ribbon cutting ceremony which would be held at noon. Colleen Rosson of the Greater Silver Valley Chamber of Commerce had a beautiful pair of scissors—not just the kind you have at home, but scissors that were "giant sized"! As the ribbon came apart, marking the official opening of the "ReUse" Store, there was clapping, cheering, yelling, and excited talking. The "ReUse" Store is now officially an official Fuller store!
