Before any digging can begin, Otis uncovers the lid to the septic tank which Joe Close, from the South Fork Sewer District, had located and marked last month.



Otis clears dirt from the sewer pipe where the trench crosses it so the power line can be laid beneath.

After spending a whole day observing and photographing the work at this site, I am truly impressed with the expertise that Otis has with his machine. I know there are other expert machine operators, like Keith Sims, but this was a pleasure to watch –I was not bored.



Dean Jenicek had agreed to have Otis also dig the holes for the forms for the snow roof supports. Here Otis listens to Dave Rust, who is erecting the roof, explains where to dig.



Bob Larson and Judy Blalack hold a "sauna" tube form steady so Verne can cut it in 3 ft. lengths to fit in the holes that Otis dug. Bob came in case we need him to make sure any leaded dirt was handled correctly. Fortunately the yard was lead free. ©
