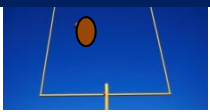

Take Exit 54 at Big Creek. Turn right on Silver Valley Rd at the Sunshine Memorial and drive 1 mile, then turn left on Johnson Rd. Go up Terror Gulch about 1/2 mile, turn right onto the paved road that crosses the creek and continue up the hill. At the top go straight onto Shoshone Blvd. and take an immediate right onto Lower Rio Vista Rd. The Haynes home site is on the upper side of the road.
