We started doing this extra work at home after COVID hit. The newsletters then only needed to have mailing labels applied and sorted by zip codes into the Post Office trays and mailed. Thus the normal mailing workshop on Tuesday now usually takes about an hour.

The newsletter I email to Janet was in the format that I use to email to others and does not need the Post Office mailing information. Last month, I forgot to add that information before having it printed. Thus, I had to run off labels with our return address and also the postal bulk mailing permit for every newsletter we mailed. I confess I did have some trouble making these labels since some of the pages *sneaked* in upside down and, of course, they had to be reprinted on the correct side—I *caught most of them*. These labels then had to be applied during our mailing workshop which extended the time to over 3 hours.

After profuse apologies to my mailing crew, they magnanimously forgave me and did not complain about the extra work nor time spent. They are fantastic and enjoy visiting together each month.

Lesson: I have been requesting help doing layout, etc., for this newsletter. ***I really truly need help.*** Over the years I have had a couple helpers who would take the information I emailed to them and designed the newsletters. Please volunteer to do this now. I really need backup for when I'm gone on trips, or maybe am sick, or just need a break. Doing the layout takes about a day including the pondering of how you want it to look. Some pages have the same format each month—the ad page and the donor page—which leaves one to be creative with the rest. I would be happy to mentor anyone willing to try. I designed my templates using Microsoft Word. They are easy to use.


