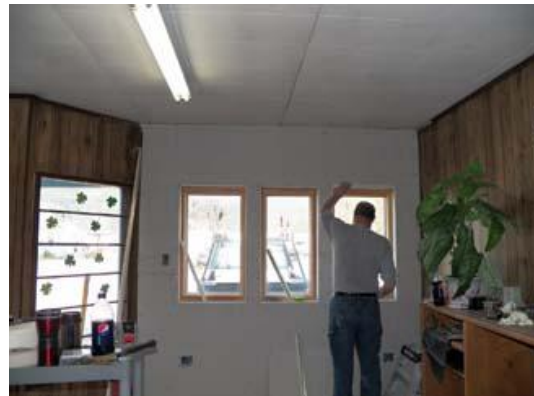

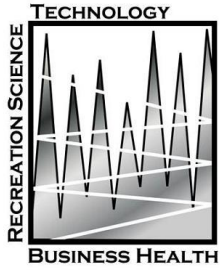


Above is an unusual donation. It is a handmade Duncan drum. They sell for \$250 new. Our price for this used one in excellent shape is \$150.

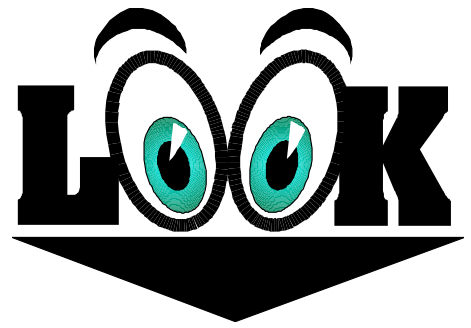
