Need New Dena Mora Rest Stop Overseer!

For Summer of 2014

Jim & Norma Seaton are stepping away from overseeing the Fundraiser Rest Stop at the first rest stops on I-90 just 5 miles East of the ID/MT border. So we are in need of someone to come along side them this year so that the transition to next year will be smooth.

This fundraiser is a fun one for those who volunteer to work it. We now have 2 trailers to serve coffee, cookies & iced tea to travelers from 8am to 4pm (Idaho time). There are people who bake us cookies and some people buy coffee, etc. to supply the trailers and those who volunteer to work either a ½ day or whole day shift. Jim & Norma usually camp over at Cabin City and are available to help out in an emergency, but this is not a prerequisite, just a fun thing to do.

Duties are all lined out for the new overseers, from calling the Montana Transportation Dept. in January to set up dates the overseers want, to applying for the Thrivent funds (lined out in a notebook) to calling people who have served and new people who would like to serve in some capacity,. then making sure the trailers are well equipped and someone will get them to the Rest Stop & back to Osburn and cleaned out and ready to be covered for winter (unless someone else wants to use them). Next is the follow-up with Thrivent.

Money is deposited at the Sheriff's Office each evening, so you would be expected to get it at the end of the week—usually a week, that would be up to the overseers.

Duties may be delegated to other volunteers as the Overseers see fit. But all of the signs, deposit slips, names of volunteers from past years, lists of supplies needed, instructions for workers, etc., are in the notebook; and forms can be transferred from the Seaton's computer for use.

Jim & Norma will be available to work next year, but not to do the whole thing. Contact them at [208-786-9903](tel:208-786-9903).

This year we have all but 2 spots for volunteers to work the trailers and we will need cookies & supplies. We are working July 11 - 17. Call Norma to volunteer for any of these opportunities to serve Fuller Center for Housing.


