While in Coeur d'Alene, she realized she wanted to live in a smaller town, so in 2014 she moved to the Silver Valley. She is also an AmeriCorps volunteer working on a rural mental health initiative with Silver Valley Cares. Over the past year she has been instrumental in helping build and maintain a list of Silver Valley Resources for people to access information for youth, people with disabilities, housing and insurance, to name a few. "When I joined, several other new people joined helping with the Silver Valley Fuller Center," she said. "A lot more people are involved now than when I joined back in 2021, and I hope that this trend continues, because the more volunteers we have, we have more capability to finish projects we are working on. For me, it has also been an opportunity for a lot of personal growth."





There is still a big need for volunteers, because there are a lot of people in the community that have limited financial resources and limited physical abilities that need help maintaining their current home. She said one of the biggest focuses for the Silver Valley Fuller Center is the Greater Blessing program. This program provides up to \$5,000 in repairs to homes throughout the valley. The residents pay back on a schedule they can afford.

"The mission of the Fuller Center is so important. We help people who are living in substandard living situations to get their water turned back on, or put in insulation," said Siobhan. "We are on the verge of doing more things, but we need some people who have construction skills to help get the projects completed."

As she helps the flowers grow and bloom in her garden at home, Siobhan also helps people in the community grow and bloom through her help as a volunteer with the Silver Valley Fuller Center.
