

**Were having a party
our 1st Annual Jackass Kickin' BBQ

We are sanctioned with Pacific Northwest BBQ Association, and this year they will provide judges, handle prizes, and help organize the event with advertising and advice. We want at least 15 to 19 participants in the cook-off. Chris Patterson, our advisor from Cd'A, has a number of BBQ friends (& competitors) who wish to come.

I envision an event like the old fashioned county fair atmosphere with lots of things for kids and family to enjoy (without the livestock, produce, etc.). We can have competitions such as cake walks, beanbag tossing, watermelon eating & seed spitting, karaoke, and Of course, this will entail help with organization and judges for the events.

The Lake City Harmonizers will be there and we are encouraging other entertainers—bands, vocalists, soloists, actors with skits, etc., to come.

Forrest Van Dorn has a flatbed trailer to use as a stage. If the weather is rainy, we can use the stage in the school gym. Some activities will be set up in the gym, also.

The BBQ contestants will be setting up early Friday morning to be ready for the judging on Saturday. They say it will be okay to come by on Friday, but they should not be disturbed on Saturday until after the judging. No food will be served until then.

We will be serving a BBQ dinner with the meat cooked by the contestants for \$10 including our usual salads & desserts & drink. Advance tickets will be for sale at \$9. For smaller appetites, we will have hot dogs & burgers available for \$5. The BBQ participants will bring their own meat for the contest and there will be separate tickets available to taste their entries. Since they pay for the meat they bring, they will keep the tasting money to help defray their cost. Those who do the tasting can vote in the "taster's choice" contest.

We are hoping a number of vendors will come and provide attractions, too.

If this is successful, it will be an attractive tourist draw to the Valley & help with the economy as well as raise funds for the Silver Valley Fuller Center's housing ministry. As it is scheduled on the last Saturday of June, we hope many will stay to enjoy the other amenities here and attend the 4th of July celebrations, also.



Our Logo, designed by Natalie Ellis, refers to Silver Valley's folklore where silver was found in a rock kicked over by prospector Noah Kellogg's jackass.

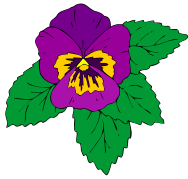
