### WHAT'S HAPPENING AT THE SMELTERVILLE SITE?

I hear the above question almost every day. Personnelwise in the latter half of August we unexpectedly were blessed with some teenagers and their leaders from the Pilgrim Lutheran Church in Puyallup, WA. They installed metal on the fascia (the board that is nailed on the ends of the rafters), painted, worked on the chain link fence, and left the wood floors unbelievably clean. {They also supplied much needed help at the ReUse Store, gave the store some firewood, and supplied firewood to Chris's great grandmother in Mullan!} What a "GREAT" crew!

Since they left, Swede and Darnell have ordered rugs for the bedrooms and are installing interior doors, etc. Chris Leetch has been helping Swede when Darnell isn't there. When neither is there, I fill in as we usually don't let our paid site supervisors work alone since our homeowners can't afford houses built by just paid personnel. The affordability of a Fuller Center home depends on volunteer labor. For example, Darnell's home would not have been affordable if we had had to pay for an electrician. Almost all of the wiring had to be replaced. When Swede doesn't have anyone else, I go over and work on the electrical. Having two people on the site at all times also makes it safer in case of an accident. Unfortunately, I've had to lay off Kevin (who is very versatile), as our funds are running low especially now that we are having initial investments in the ReUse Store.

### THE BIRTHING OF A REUSE STORE

Battles rarely work out as planned, but battles must be planned for. And, so it goes almost every day we work at getting our ReUse Store in shape.

The building was (and is) horribly dirty due to the years spent working inside on oily machinery. Part of the shop area has been steam cleaned (thanks, Kevin). However, oily deposits still remain. They have to be scraped, brushed and scrubbed several times by hand. It will probably be weeks (or months?) before this is done, as the walls and ceilings are also covered with oily deposits. In the meantime we must sell as much as we can to, hopefully, cover expenses. So, we have to price things, an interesting task. (How much is a used toilet seat worth?) Trying to keep the display areas clean while trying not to track oil in from the shop areas is a continuous challenge.

Every day we volunteers plan whether to clean the display areas, clean the shop areas, get rid of the stuff left inside and outside the building, bring more stuff in to sell from our various sheds, or wait until we get more room for it, etc. And, like generals, our plans often don't work out but are usually pleasantly interrupted by people coming in looking around, buying things, asking questions, donating things themselves or giving us things we have to pick up.

Of course, when you give birth you really don't know what you'll get, however, many people are telling us that the community really needs a second hand store like this and that gives us hope that the birthing of this ReUse Store will be successful.

PS: When you contractors have things left over at the end of a job that require as much or more money to transport and store them for more they are worth,—remember you can give them to us, write them off, and come out ahead.

When I was at Darnell's a few days ago, it looked like we are about ready for the final plumbing and heating inspection. Mark Magnus (the carpentry inspector) has given us the go ahead to finish the carpentry, and we have the go ahead to finish the electrical. And NO, I won't give any expectant finish date as we are dependent on volunteers to help Swede, and we presently have less than \$4,000 to spend on the home. However, both Darnell and I hope she can be in before winter arrives.



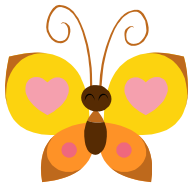
